JAZZ FESTIVAL PERFORMANCE AND CLINIC LOCATIONS



UNIVERSITY OF IDAHO JAZZ FESTIVAL

Summary of Rules

ENSEMBLE STRUCTURE

Instrumental Jazz Ensemble Division

Vocal Jazz Ensemble Division

Non-mixed Vocal Jazz Ensemble

Large ensembles should consist of at least 10 players. These groups must perform jazz, not rock. Directors or professional musicians may NOT perform with HIGH SCHOOL large ensembles that are entered in competition. JUNIOR HIGH VOCAL ENSEMBLES will not be required to use a student accompanist, however, if the accompanist is not a student, he/she must not sing or perform solos with the group.

Vocal Combo Division

Instrumental Combo Division

Combos may enter if there are 9 or less players in the group. These groups must perform jazz, not rock. Director or professional accompanist may, if necessary, accompany (piano only) high school or junior high school combos entered in competition.

Vocal Soloist Division

Instrumental Soloist Division

Open to vocalists and instrumentalists for the purpose of demonstrating improvisational ability. Director or professional accompanist may, if necessary, accompany (piano only) high school or junior high school soloists entered in the competition.

PERFORMING STANDARDS — Any group not following these regulations will be disqualified. High School Large Ensembles (Vocal and Instrumental)

Non-mixed Vocal Ensembles

1. All groups will perform three charts, including one up-tempo and one ballad style chart; however, if you use a chart that has an extensive portion of each of the tempo classifications rather than separate up-tempo and ballad charts, you are only required to perform two charts (in order to stay within the time limit). 2. Each group will have six different charts prepared. One of the charts to be performed will be randomly chosen by the director throwing a dice over the shoulder.

5. The six charts must be listed on the List of Charts and Soloists form, and three copies must be given to the site manager prior to the performance.

4. The randomly chosen chart may be programmed by the director.

5. There is a time limit of 20 minutes for each performing group, which includes set-up time, performance, and leaving the stage area. Groups going over the time limit will be disqualified from the final competition (not including the sight reading competition).

Junior High School Large Ensembles (Vocal and Instrumental) Critique Only Large Ensembles (H.S. or Jr. H.S.)

Combos (Vocal and Instrumental)

- 1. All groups will perform three charts, including one up-tempo and one ballad style.
- 2. There is a time limit of 20 minutes for each performing group, which includes set-up time, performance, and leaving the stage area.

Soloists (Vocal and Instrumental)

1. The soloist must perform an up-tempo and a ballad style chart or one that includes both styles.

The soloist must demonstrate the ability to improvise.

3. The rhythm section may consist of any combination of piano, bass, drums, and guitar.

4. There is a limit of 4 instrumentalists plus soloist on stage at one time.

5. There is a time limit of 15 minutes for each soloist entry, which includes set-up, performance, and leaving the stage area.

There will be sight reading for all competing groups, with the exception of vocal or instrumental COMBOS, and NON-MIXED VOCAL ensembles. The rating will not affect the outcome of the regular performance. There will be consistent assurance of the regular performance. will be separate awards for sight reading.

Three outstanding ensembles will be chosen from each class of competition. The top group from each class will perform at the conclusion of their respective day's competition. In the event of a tie, both groups will perform on the evening concert at which time the judges will make their final decision. (Schools wishing perform on the evening concert at which time the judges will make their final decision. (Schools wishing to enter more than one large group in the festival may do so and may enter the second group one classification lower than the normal status. Any school may compete in a higher size classification if the director so desires). 28






