

CNR DEI Vision Statement

The University of Idaho College of Natural Resources (CNR) strives to embody the University of Idaho's land grant mission, including its commitment to Equity, Diversity and Inclusion.

CNR joins the University in defining these terms as follows. **Equity** is the guarantee of fair treatment, access, opportunity and advancement for all students, faculty and staff while striving to identify and eliminate barriers that have prevented the full participation of some groups. **Diversity** describes psychological, physical and social differences that occur among all individuals. **Inclusion** is the act of creating involvement, empowerment and environments in which any individual or group is welcomed, respected, supported, valued and able to fully participate.

CNR recognizes the importance of increasing and maintaining the diversity of its student body, faculty, and staff to achieve U of I's land grant access mission and to support long-term, sustainable success of natural resources fields. Creating an inclusive environment and striving for inclusive excellence will foster success for the College, its programs and its members, both academically and professionally.
