Student Ambassador Application

Due by Sunday April 16th for the 2023-24 academic year.

The College of Education, Health and Human Sciences Ambassadors are a select group of students representing all departments within our college who assist the college in recruitment and retention of highly qualified students.

Ambassadors have opportunities to develop communication and leadership skills, strengthen professionalism, and establish working relations with university faculty, students, staff, and alumni. Ambassadors attend trainings, develop leadership skills, and participate in a variety of College of Education, Health and Human Sciences recruitment, retention, and promotional activities.

Serving as an Ambassador in the College of Education, Health and Human Sciences is an honor and a privilege. Being an Ambassador requires 20-30 hours per semester. If accepted into the program, a minimum of one year and maximum of two years of service is expected. There is one academic credit offered for participation each semester.

Selection process:

1. Applicants submit a complete application and letter of interest.
2. Applications and letters will be reviewed by a committee.
3. After the application deadline each spring, a pool of applicants will be contacted for an interview.
4. Selected student ambassadors will be notified to register for the College of Education, Health and Human Sciences Ambassador course (1 credit) for fall semester.

Eligible applicants *must*:

- ✓ be full-time students in the College of Education, Health and Human Sciences
- ✓ have and maintain a minimum UI GPA of 3.0
- ✓ have completed at least one semester at the University of Idaho
- ✓ be able to commit to one year of service
- ✓ be available and willing to regularly attend the scheduled class sessions
- ✓ be willing to participate in evening and weekend events
- ✓ commit to ambassador trainings and 20-30 hours of service per semester
- ✓ be highly motivated, enthusiastic, dependable, knowledgeable, and sincere in representing the University of Idaho College of Education, Health and Human Sciences

Benefits to being an Ambassador:

- Potential scholarship per year, amount to be determined (to be deposited in student accounts in the fall)
- Opportunities to travel and to learn more about the state of Idaho

- Transcribed leadership experience
 - Professional networking
 - Leadership development
 - Interaction with university leadership and alumni
 - Opportunity to promote the University of Idaho and the College of Education at your high school alma mater
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Applicants must submit this completed application, along with a letter that includes:

1. A brief autobiography (100 words maximum)
2. Why serving as a College of Education, Health and Human Sciences Ambassador is important to you (100 words maximum)
3. How your qualities will contribute to your effectiveness as an Ambassador (100 words maximum)
4. What you hope to gain from the program (100 words maximum)
