- I. Approval of the minutes from October 2, 2019
  - Quinnett moved to approve. Seconded by Strawn.
  - Approved with 2 abstentions Heinse, Tenuto.
- II. Announcements and Reports
  - A. Introduce Penny Tenuto (EHHS)
    - Penny is the representative from EHHS through Fall 2019
  - B. LSAMP Update
    - 4 students have been identified for this program.
  - C. Library reported that the Elsevier contract is being renegotiated. Not yet sure what will be lost.

## III. Old Business

- A. Transfer of 300/400 Level Courses from Other Institutions (attachment)
  - The catalog language for transfer credits was amended to say that courses transferred must be on a post-bachelors or graduate transcript and must be at the 400 level or above.
  - Hardy moved to approve. Seconded by Quinnett.
  - Approved unanimously.
- B. 500/600 Credits on Non-Thesis Degrees (attachment)
  - Catalog language concerning credits allowed on a non-thesis master's degree was discussed. Councilmembers discussed whether 500 and/or 600 credits should be counted toward a non-thesis degree.
  - Comments:
    - -"The lab is a classroom; therefore, they should count."
    - -Sometimes in Anthropology, for example, a student intends to do a thesis, but what they get from the dig they do does not elicit a thesis, so they have to switch to a non-thesis.
    - -It was reported that some engineering faculty are opposed to using 500 credits on a non-thesis degree. A/B work in 500 research does not necessarily equal coursework.
    - -COGS has been handling this issue on a case-by-case basis. It is time to have a guideline created.
  - Murdoch suggested allowing a maximum of 6 credits on a non-thesis degree.
  - Yager: could they then use 12 credits of non-coursework on a non-thesis degree? McMurtry: No, it would have to be either/or.
  - Murdoch moved to approve. Seconded by Quinnett.
  - Passed with one opposed.
- C. Research Credit Limitations on Doctoral Degrees (attachment)

- Members voted to clean up "Requirements for Doctoral Degrees" in the catalog.
- They moved to increase the number of 599 non-thesis credits allowed from 5 to 6. They also added language that 300-399 courses my not be used to make up deficiencies.
- Moved to approve by Quinnett. Seconded buy Hill.
- Approved unanimously.
- D. Posthumous Degree Policy
  - Law will add their language to the policy, and it will be brought back to a future meeting.

## IV. New Business

- A. Curriculum Items
  - 1. Accountancy
    - -Add ACCT 555 and remove ACCT 590.
    - -Zadehgol moved to approve. Seconded by Hardy.
    - -Approved unanimously.
  - 2. M.S. Water Resources
  - 3. Ph.D. Water Resources
    - -Items 2 and 3 were voted on together.
    - -Remove WR 507. Reduce WR 506 to 2 credits from 3.
    - -Rationale had some incorrect language in it per WR faculty on Graduate Council.
  - -Yager made a motion to approve 2 and 3 together with the rationale struck from the proposal and with a typo fixed changing WR 506 to 2 credits on each page. Seconded by Cronan.
    - -Approved unanimously.
  - 4. Statistics Graduate Certificate
    - -General housekeeping changes to the Stats Graduate Certificate.
    - -Hardy moved to approve. Seconded by Tank.
    - -Approved unanimously.
  - 5. Discontinuances (attachments x 3)
    - a. M.Ed. / M.S. Rehab Counseling and Human Services
  - -They stopped taking applicants and are teaching out the cohort. They will be done Spring 2020.
    - b. Rehab Counseling Certificate
    - c. M.Ed. / M.S. School Counseling
    - -This program ended in 2012/2013.
    - -This is to discontinue all of these programs officially.
    - -Quinnett moved to approve. Seconded by Zadehgol.
    - -Approved unanimously.
- B. Summer Registration Requirement
  - Language needs to be written that is compliant with federal funding sources.
  - McMurtry will look at other institutions and will bring it back to a future meeting.
