 - -- Can one TA line be cannibalized to cover SHIP for TA's?
 - ---Not sure.
 - B. Visit Day

 - C. 3-year Degrees
 - Expanded to include students in the Barcelona accord.
 - Is there interest in expanding this? For example, to New Zealand and/or India.
 - Will be brought back for future discussion.
 - D. CGS April 15 Resolution
 - CGS memo was sent to all deans. This prevents poaching.
 - E. Professional Degrees on Thesis and Dissertation Committees
 - Example given of current situation where a person with an MD wants to serve on a Ph.D. committee
 - Members concur that the person would not be qualified to assess the exam, which is the thesis/dissertation defense. What is the necessity?

 - Proposal is to drop from 33 to 30 credits because other departments in Engineering require 30 credits. National average for MEng degrees is 30 credits.

- 4. Nuclear Graduate Certificate (Alice Allen)
 - o UI would be the only school in the nation that has this certificate program.
 - Questions/Comments
 - -Will it be associated with a degree program? -- It can be. It is also a stand-alone certificate.
 - -Did INL request this? Not specifically. This came from faculty researching trends and seeing where needs will be.
 - -Is there a certification test? -- No. This is not certification.
 - Heinse moved to approve. Seconded by Hill.
 - Passed unanimously.
- 5. Dietetics (Hydee Becker)
 - o M.S. in Dietetics. Mandate for credentialing exam.
 - o 55 credit professional Master's. Non-thesis. Possibly a 3+2.
