## III. Old Business

- a. Catalog adjustments. Motion. Vote 10/0/0 Approved.
  - For the Ph.D. and Ed.D., a minimum of 78 credits beyond the bachelor's degree is required. At least 52 credits must be at the 500 level or above and at least 33 of the 78 credits must be in courses other than 600 (Doctoral Research and Dissertation). A maximum of 45 <u>research</u> credits in <u>600 (Doctoral Research and Dissertation) including a maximum of</u> 6 credits of 599 (Non-thesis Research) or 500 (Master's Research and Thesis) may be <u>in the 45 research credits</u> used toward the degree.

For the D.A.T., a minimum of 66 credits is required and follows a prescribed set of courses set by the program.

 Discussed the phrasing of this section in the catalog and found an error in the number of credits between the MFA program specific page and the COGS page. We need to correct "20" credits to reflect the 1/3 of program rule and make the following red/strike out amendments. Motion. Vote: 10/0/0

A student who has a conferred master's degree or is working on one may obtain a second master's degree only in a different major, and subject to the approval of the dean of the College of Graduate Studies <u>upon applying to the second program or adding the curriculum</u>. Up to six credits of course work used to satisfy the requirements for the first degree may be applied to the second; all other catalog requirements and credit requirements in UI courses must be fulfilled. <del>If the courses are transfer courses, they are counted as a part of the credits that are allowed for transfer, correspondence, non-degree, over-aged credits, and credits moved from an undergraduate transcript.</del> With department approval, a student in the M.F.A. Theater Arts program may use up to 20 credits from a M.A. Theater Arts degree toward the MFA degree. A student who is enrolled in a doctoral program or who has a doctorate may obtain a master's degree in a different field and use up to 6 common credits, or more, if approved by Graduate Council. A student who has a doctorate may not subsequently obtain a master's degree in the same field.

a. Discussion of recommendations for admission packets from 3 mandatory to 2 but leave it up to the departments to decide if they want more than 2 and in which format whether question/answer prompts, audio/video formats, formal letter or other. Move to vote. Vote 9/0/1 Approved.
