- Update on COVID-19 testing from Provost Lawrence: to date, we have completed 7,700 tests, with about 1.1% positive results. - David Lee-Painter, chair of the COVID-19 Advisory Committee, provided a brief update on the committee's progress. The committee is proceeding well and moving forward.
- Jan Johnson gave an update on the recent activities of the UBUNTU committee. They have been
 working on a diversity resolution with several groups and faculty. Soon, UBUNTU will bring the
 resolution before Senate for a vote. Interesting ideas were exchanged, such as working with the
 Sociology department to include in the curriculum classes on systemic racism.
- FSH 6990 Communicable Disease Emergency Response.
 Senate discussed this newly proposed policy. The purpose is to have a permanent policy to replace FSH 6990 COVID-19 Emergency Response, which is valid for 180 days and will expire on September 16, 2020. The discussion will continue next week.

- Update on COVID-19 from Provost Lawrence: Surveillance testing has been moved up last week as
 a reaction to the increasing number of COVID-19 cases in Whitman County. We have started testing
 wastewater for evidence of Corona virus. Results from last Friday showed noticeable amount of
 COVID-19 in two dorm areas. Students who live in those areas will be tested. Our isolation protocol
 continues to work well. As the situation evolves, updates will be provided on a weekly basis.
- David Lee-Painter, chair of the COVID-19 Advisory Committee, gave a brief update on the committee's progress. Please direct any questions to davidlp@uidaho.edu.
- FSH 6990 Communicable Disease Emergency Response: The discussion continued from the
 previous meeting. The Senators agreed on an amended version of the policy, which will be
 presented to the faculty for a vote at the first Fall faculty meeting. The purpose is to have a
 permanent policy to replace temporary FSH 6990 COVID-19 Emergency Response, which is
 about to expire.

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Faculty Senate Talking Points, September 15, 2020:

- Update on COVID-19: Six hundred students from dorm areas where the wastewater revealed the presence of the Corona virus were tested, and 6 were found to be positive. To date, 8,500 tests have been performed, and the positive rate is still around 1.1%.
- The air quality situation is serious. Air filters are being clogged by the oily smoke. For the time being, we are back to online/virtual instruction. If you need to access a building, contact Campus Security at 885-2254. Watch out for updates.
- "Talks with Torrey" will restart on Thursday 9/24 at 11:30am, alternating between Thursday and Wednesday.
- Senate approved new FSH 1590 Unit Bylaws. The policy allows more uniformity across the various units, thus facilitating the process of developing and reviewing bylaws.
- Brian Smentkowski, CETL Director, visited Senate to celebrate faculty success. In Spring 2020 and Summer 2020, faculty have invested 13,338 and 15,120 faculty development hours, respectively.
- Suzi Ball, Vandal Gateway Coordinator, gave an overview on the current status of the program. There are presently 24 students, a smaller cohort than anticipated. An interesting discussion developed around possible next steps.

- Update on COVID-19: Yesterday's email from President Green contained the latest information about COVID-19 testing. An increased rate of positive results was found among those who traveled for the holiday weekend. We will continue to be vigilant.
- University Ombuds Laura Smythe has published the annual report for the Ombuds Office for the 2020 Academic Year. See the report.
- "Talks with Torrey" starts Thursday 9/24 at 11:30am.
- Borah Symposium: The 2020 (virtual) Borah Foundation Symposium starts next week. The keynote speakers will be Beatrice Fihn and Kim Campbell. Beatrice Fihn is Executive Director of the International Campaign to Abolish Nuclear Weapons (ICAN), the 2017 Nobel Peace Prize Laureate. She will speak Monday, September 28, at 12:30. Kim Campbell is the first and only female Prime Minister of Canada and has spent her career shattering barriers for women and speaking out on human rights and the impact of climate change. 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Faculty Senate Talking Points, September 29, 2020:

- Update on COVID-19: We had two weeks of increased infection rate due to "hot spots" in the Greek system. Surveillance testing has increased significantly – about 1,200 tests were done this week. Anyone who received an invitation to participate in surveillance testing is strongly encouraged to participate.
- By Friday, we should know whether we return to in-person instruction or move online. In any case, there will be a communication this Friday.
- Homecoming is next week largely virtual, with few in-person events following standard protocol. The focus will be on current students rather than alumni returning to campus.
- Spring schedule: There was a discussion about possible options to maximize safety. A survey to
 collect broad feedback will go out as soon as possible. A document explaining the available options
 will be attached to the email announcing the survey.

- Congratulations to our Chair Barb Kirchmeier! She received for the second time a state recognition as this year "Most Innovative Educator for Written Communication."

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Faculty Senate Talking Points, October 6, 2020:

- Update on COVID-19: We continue to have some concerns about the Greek system, and several
 Greek Houses are in quarantine. All students will be tested. For the time being, the class delivery
 method is at the instructor's discretion.
- Spring schedule: The survey sent to staff, faculty, and students is closed. We received 2,913
 responses (about 28-30% of the university population) and 7,000 comments. Starting the semester
 a week later and forgoing Spring Break was the least popular option, while most people are in favor
 of making no changes. The option of a late (April) Spring Break and classes fully online after that
 was a close second.
- Review of the R1 White Paper. There was a lively discussion with President Scott Green, Executive Special Assistant to the President Chandra Zenner Ford, and Interim Vice President for Research and Economic Development, Brad Ritts. The R1 Working Group visited Senate to receive reactions and feedback so they can best guide the next Vice President for Research and Economic Development, Chris Nomura.

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Faculty Senate Talking Points, October 13, 2020:

- Registrar Lindsey Brown, IT Vice President Dan Ewart, and Ubuntu Co-Chairs Kristin Haltinner and Jan Johnson visited Senate for a conversation on the use of preferred names vs. legal names for students. Already last year, a working group recommended to move forward, but it will take time and resources. Senate strongly recommends to start with BbLearn, which is the primary mode for faculty to engage with students.
- The Faculty Affairs Committee (FAC) is considering proposing FSH changes to address course delivery issues which have come up during the pandemic. Rich Seamon, Chair of FAC, and the Faculty Secretary, ex-officio FAC member, initiated an input-gathering discussion with Senate.
- COVID-19 update: The news is generally good. Campus-wide testing showed a clear downward trend. Two weeks ago we ramped up testing and saw the rate go down last week and even further this week. Plans to return to original class formats will be definite once all the on-going comprehensive testing will be completed.
- The Palouse Literary Festival will be on Zoom this week. This festival is organized by MA and MFA graduate students in the department of English. This year's events include readings by MFA alum and award-winning author Joe Wilkins. Zoom link for all events: https://uidaho.zoom.us/j/7242893322
- Tuesday October 20, the 2020 Community Talk will be delivered by Common Read author Cristina Henriquez, who will be talking about her book, The Book of Unknown Americans. It's open to the public. register in advance.

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Faculty Senate Talking Points, October 20, 2020:

- Faculty Senate Leadership, along with the Provost's Office and CETL are creating a questionnaire to
 gather information from everyone who is teaching this semester. The survey will help us all
 understand what teaching was like this Fall across campuses, disciplines, and formats. Please
 complete the survey to help us better understand your teaching experience this semester.
- COVID-19 update: There has been significant improvement over the last two weeks. Currently only
 one Greek House is in quarantine, from 14 a few weeks ago. Seven students are currently isolating
 in Targhee. We returned to original class formats today. With increased positivity rates in Southern
 Idaho and nationwide, we all need to be careful and continue to follow mask and distancing
 protocol.
- Director of General Education Dean Panttaja gave a brief overview on the State Board of Education "Idaho Online" program. The primary benefit of Idaho Online will be to increase access and affordability to postsecondary education in Idaho, particularly in remote and rural areas of the state. Idaho Online will support sharing of common resources, services, and practices to benefit all forms of postsecondary educational delivery across the state. It will include a platform for expanding the joint delivery of online teaching and learning across institutions by simplifying registration, cost, and credit transfer.
- Vice President of Finance and Administration Brian Foisy gave an update on the university financial status breaking down the GenEd budget into its components. Although, overall, we were able to build a surplus, we are still facing budget challenges for the next fiscal year.

- The Ubuntu committee presented a Resolution on Equity, Diversity, Inclusion, and Social Justice. (The document can be found attached to the minutes of Senate Meeting #11.) The Senators voted unanimously to support the Ubuntu Resolution. Thanks to Jan Johnson and all who have contributed to this important effort!
- COVID-19 update: Last week testing showed 2.3% positive rate. No Greek Houses are presently on formal quarantine, from 14 a few weeks ago. The recent Governor's order has put Idaho back to stage 3, with exemptions for educational (and some other) activities. It is not yet clear how our events will be impacted.
- The VandalStar Team Kristin McMullin, Cynthia Castro, Mary Oswald, Madison Domka, and Lisa Ormond – gave a presentation on various features of VandalStar. They reported positive student feedback for tools such as "My Success Network," "Appointment scheduling," and "Course Performance Feedback." The Vandal Star Team is available and happy to help faculty.
- Director of General Education Dean Panttaja came back to Senate to address any follow-up questions from his last week presentation on Online Idaho. There was a lively discussion on the Canvas Learning Managing System, which the university can use at no charge for one year, vs. Blackboard.

- COVID-19 update: we had another week of improvement. We have currently zero students in isolation, no Greek Houses in quarantine, and six students in one of our campus quarantine facilities. We continue with surveillance testing and our positivity rate continues to go down, in contrast to what is happening around us.
- A reminder to check in with students to see how things are going for them. All instructional faculty
 were sent an email at the beginning of this week encouraging them to conduct a mid-semester
 check in with students in their courses. This email included a framework and questions developed
 by ASUI, the Teaching Committee, CETL, and the Provost's Office.
- The University of Idaho will lease its steam plant and utility system to a concessionaire as part of a public-private partnership (P3) that will allow investment in student access, success and research initiatives for the next 50 years. The 50-year lease and concession agreement with Sacyr Plenary Utility Partners Idaho LLC was approved by the Idaho State Board of Education on November 2. These funds are expected to generate \$6M annually for the university to invest in strategic initiatives. President Green and Vice President Foisy came to Senate to answer questions.
- The 2020-21 Senate Leadership has created a space to hold open conversations in the form of roundtables during Senate meetings. This week, Diane Kelly-Riley and Torrey Lawrence participated into a roundtable discussion about faculty workload. The goal is to look for solutions, generate ideas, propose policy changes or creation.

- Update on spring semester schedule: U of I will open in person on Wednesday, January 13. Initially, the plan was for all classes to be online the first week to make sure students can be tested prior to in-person classes. • Last week, an email was sent to all Senators listing the guests Senate Leadership plan to invite to Senate this spring. Please remember to reach out to your constituents to gather questions and input. It will inform and guide our conversations with our guests.

Update on COVID-19:

- Last week, 14 tests resulted positive out of 778 (1.8%). At this time, four students are in isolation and seven in our quarantine facilities.
- We will plan for fall semester anticipating contingencies. Plans for after spring break should become more clear within the next two to three weeks.
- o Commencement plans: we are preparing multiple options. We'll know more in March.
- The state of Idaho decided that university employees will not receive the vaccine at the same time as K-12 teachers. The university is talking about this with the State Board and Public Health.

Finances:

- Overall, enrollment is down by 3.5% with respect to Spring 2020, with graduate students being the largest declining group. On the other hand, some colleges have reported an increase in enrollment.
- Furlough is over and no need for additional furlough is expected. State budget is being discussed this week –the news seems generally good.
- Concerning federal funds: through the "Care Act Part 2," the university has been allocated \$11.6M of which \$3.4M must go to students.
- The new budget model, to be applied in program prioritization for both academic and non-academic units, will be implemented July 1, 2021, but the transition will be gradual.

- Plans to reorganize the Provost Office are being worked out, with the goal to increase efficiency.

We believe in science and in seeking knowledge by weighing appropriate evidence and rejecting intentional misinformation. As citizens and educators who serve the university's land-grant mission, we prepare students to be thoughtful, civic-minded participants in our local, state, and national communities. We are committed to democracy and due process, and to civil discourse and respectful communication. We condemn in the strongest terms any form of violence and terrorism.
 - To support these goals, we encourage all faculty, when appropriate, to directly address the issues and challenges facing our world, including misinformation, radicalism, racism, bigotry, and violence. We call for a collective commitment to shine light on the root causes of polarization and extremism. Whether by analyzing our histories and culture, or cultivating information literacy, or teaching responsible communication skills, faculty must continue to provide a transformative and ethical education for the next generation of leaders.
