# The "EPAF"

An "Electronic Personnel Action Form" (EPAF) is created for your position and travels to several departments for review and approval before being applied to Banner (UI's administrative system). Once your EPAF is applied, you become an "official" UI employee. Almost everything at the UI is dependent on your EPAF. You will need an applied EPAF in order to be paid, to access MyUI, to sign up for training, and to access other programs necessary to do your job. Please check with your supervisor to verify the status of your EPAF.

# MyUI

Once your EPAF has been processed you can access MyUI at my.uidaho.edu. In MyUI you can update your addresses, emergency contact information, view pay stubs and work history, check your leave balances, review your W4 information, access the myBenefits link, work on specific administrative tasks, and more. If you are enrolled as a student, your student information will be found here as well. As a board appointed employee, you can log in using your network username and password.

#### Banner

Banner is the UI's administrative system. If Banner access is necessary for your new position you will need to follow the instructions at <u>https://www.uidaho.edu/human-resources/edl/learning-opportunities/bannertraining</u>.

### Vandal Card

The Vandal Card is the official employee ID card for staff, faculty, and affiliated persons. Vandal Cards are used for many purposes on campus. It provides access to numerous events and facilities including athletic events, recreational facilities, the Student Health Center, and the library. Many locations use it for door access. #### Vandal Alert

Vandal Alert is an institution-wide emergency notification system, and all students, staff and faculty are automatically enrolled. If the Vandal Alert system is activated by the university, you are contacted through phone numbers and email addresses that you have previously provided to the university with a short message about the emergency. Included in the message will be a brief description of the emergency and any actions you need to take, as appropriate. Parking and Transportation Information/Options

The University of Idaho campus is less than one square mile and is within walking or biking distance of many residential areas in Moscow. When walking or biking isn't feasible, FREE public transportation is provided by SMART Transit, Monday – Saturday, 6:30 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., with several stops on campus. For those living in a neighboring community, the City of Moscow offers a cost-effective VanPool option. Board appointed employees are eligible for all tiers of commuter parking permits, payroll deduction for payment, and auto-renewing permit options are available. If driving every day isn't required, 10-day parking permits allowing for flexible parking (non-consecutive days) are available and can be purchased throughout the year as needed.
