

SERVICES FOR STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES

The University of Idaho has established services for students with disabilities in accordance with Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended, and with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) of 1990 as amended.

In Idaho Falls, a UI student who requests assistance should be directed Counseling, Testing and Career Services (CTCS) at Idaho State University in the Bennion Student Union Building. The number for that office is 282-7750. Staff in CTCS are equipped to handle the necessary documentation and obtain appropriate help for the student (i.e. readers, notetakers, computers, etc.). Students with need for accommodations should be encouraged to call.

Please remember that while the initial approach needs to be made by the student, you may open an avenue for discussion. Keep in mind that accommodations are a confidential matter covered under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA).
