

## FIRST AID: TRAINING REQUIREMENTS & EQUIPMENT

### **TRAINING REQUIREMENTS:**

A sufficient number of employees and supervisors, or persons in direct charge of work crews are required to be trained in first-aid and CPR treatment. To qualify as a trained person, selected individuals must have a current first-aid card, obtained by successfully completing an approved and certified standard first-aid and adult CPR course.

### **TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES:**

Certification is a two-part process. The first part is done online through AHA, and then a skills test must be completed to obtain the certification. Although anyone may take the online portion, Environmental Health and Safety can only offer the skills testing to University employees and a budget number is required for payment. ### **GENERAL INFORMATION:**

Employees should be directed to seek first-aid or medical treatment after receiving an injury, and to report all injuries to their supervisor promptly.

**IF AN INJURY IS WORK-RELATED, THE INJURED PERSON SHOULD BE ADVISED OF THEIR RIGHT TO FILE A WORKERS COMPENSATION CLAIM.** To initiate a claim, call Environmental Health and Safety, (208) 885-6524.

Departments must ensure suitable telephone or radio communications at the nearest reasonable point for each work area, and are responsible for implementing a definite procedure to be followed in the event of a serious injury. Instructions covering this procedure must be made available to all employees. If an employee is injured, a suitable means of transportation to required medical services must be made available.

When practical, a poster is to be fastened and maintained either on or in the cover of each first-aid cabinet, and at or near all phones, plainly stating the phone numbers of emergency services. Cards that may be used for this purpose on the University's Moscow campus may be obtained upon request from Public Safety and Security, (208) 885-7177.

### **FIRST-AID KITS:**

Departments are responsible for establishing a procedure to ensure that adequately stocked first-aid kits are available and accessible to all employees, and that kits are maintained in a serviceable condition. Where the eyes or body of any person may be exposed to injurious chemicals and/or materials, suitable facilities for quick drenching or flushing must be provided, within the work area, for emergency use.

Approved first-aid kits and replacement packages for kits may be purchased through Facilities Management Stores or off-campus vendors. To order through FM Stores, call (208) 885-7555 or send e-mail orders to [shopstores@uidaho.edu](mailto:shopstores@uidaho.edu).

It is required that all University vehicles used to transport employees be equipped with first-aid kits of sufficient size to meet the needs of employees transported in that vehicle. First-aid kits also are required at jobsites where first-aid supplies, stations, or their equivalent are not readily accessible or available. At least one first-aid kit must be available to employees working on construction jobs, line crews, and other transient or short-term jobs.

The size of the first aid kit at the job site is determined by the number of personnel normally dependent upon each kit.

151 - 200	two - 36 unit kits

**CONTENTS:**

First Aid Kits must contain shaded items and must be maintained at their ten (10), sixteen (16), twenty-four (24) or thirty-six (36) unit level. Unshaded items are recommended.

**SUPPLEMENTS:**

Additional items may be added to first-aid kits that might be of use in specific work environments and conditions. Examples of such items are chemical cold packs, topical bee sting medication, saline eyewash solution, and additions to the variety and type of bandages routinely contained in kits.

Due to the possibility that some persons may experience serious allergic or drug interaction reactions if certain over-the-counter medications are taken, **please ensure that first-aid kits do not contain ingestible medications of any kind.**
