_____ Immigration Clinic – Moscow and Boise (preference to Moscow based students); fall & spring: represent clients in appeals before the Ninth Circuit and Board of Immigration Appeals; represent clients before the Immigration Court, the Asylum Office and in interviews for other immigration benefits; conduct community outreach and education and trainings for the bench and bar.

_____ Entrepreneurship Law Clinic – Boise; fall & spring: business formation, trademark & transactional work.

_____ Family Justice Clinic – Boise; summer, fall & spring: DVPO’s, family law.

_____ Housing Clinic – Boise; fall & spring: eviction defense, tenants’ rights. (The housing clinic is still being developed. If the clinic is not operational by fall 2021, a housing practicum will be available instead. Please note whether you would be interested in the practicum as an alternative experiential opportunity).

If you are selected for a clinic, we will assume you will enroll in it and complete the semester or semesters for which you applied. We will accept cases and make other commitments based on that assumption. You are expected to complete a minimum of 135 hours of clinic work in order to receive 3 credits for clinic. If you are unsure whether you will be able to fulfill this commitment, please indicate that on this application.

You are responsible for making sure you have acquired your limited license PRIOR to the start of your clinic work. The clinic staff will help you complete your applications and submit them to the bar, but it is ultimately your responsibility to ensure that your limited license is processed in time for the start of your clinic work. Students who begin the semester without their limited license may find their clinic grades adversely affected as some students may need to appear in court or file documents with the court the very first week of class. If you are using a limited license for summer work, you also must file for a change/addition of supervising attorney with the Idaho State Bar. This also needs to be done PRIOR to the start of your clinic work because our faculty cannot supervise you on your limited license obtained for your summer work supervisors.
