

Jonah Horwitz is an attorney in the Capital Habeas Unit for the Federal Defender Services of Idaho. In that capacity, he represents death-row inmates in federal habeas proceedings and state post-conviction actions in Idaho and Nevada. Jonah graduated in 2006 from the honors program at Swarthmore College with a major in philosophy and a minor in history. In 2010, he received his law degree from Northwestern University, where he worked in the MacArthur Justice Center, interned in a U.S. Attorney's Office, and was awarded Order of the Coif. After law school, Jonah clerked for four years for three judges: a federal magistrate in Texas, a state supreme court justice in Wisconsin, and a judge on the Tenth Circuit in Oklahoma. He was hired as a Research and Writing attorney by the Capital Habeas Unit in 2014, and promoted to Assistant Federal Defender the next year. Independently from his work at the Federal Defenders, Jonah is the Chair of the Amicus Committee for the Idaho Association of Criminal Defense Lawyers.
