- (2) Closely read the ‘Problems’ from the *Ethical Problems in the Practice of Law* text, consider the relevant law, and imagine how you would apply the law to the facts. Part of our class discussion will concern these problems, and all students should be prepared to discuss the problems in detail.
- (3) Be prepared to answer all questions from the assigned reading in the *Ethical Problems in the Practice of Law* text.

¹You should read the language of the model rules listed on the class schedule for any particular day. The class schedule notes the first time any particular rule is discussed in depth in the textbook, but not every rule that is mentioned in the assigned reading, and it does not list rules more than once (e.g., if Rule 1.7 is covered in both class 15 and 17, the schedule will only list it on the assigned reading for class 15). If it would help your comprehension of an issue, I recommend reviewing the relevant language for any rule, along with any relevant comments, discussed in the assigned reading. While students are welcome to examine the other materials provided in the supplement, such preparation is not necessary on a day-to-day basis.
