New student move-in day will be taking place on August 14 from 8 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. In order to help make your move-in smooth, students are required to sign up for a check-in time slot. Time slots start at 8 a.m. and run every half hour until 4:30 p.m. Sign-up for your timeslot on the Housing Portal at **iwanthousing.uidaho.edu** through your housing application. Each hall has a different check-in location (see map on page 3) to allow students to park and unload closer to their building.

UPON ARRIVAL

Unloading Your Vehicle

There are two temporary unloading zones marked on the map. During unloading, someone should remain with the vehicle. After unloading, please make room for the next car. We have allocated specific Move-In day parking. These parking lots are adjacent to the residence halls and will be marked (See map).

Move-In Carts

Housing and Residence Life will have a limited number of carts and moving dollies for students to use while moving their belongings to their room. Carts must be returned to the location you received them.

BEFORE YOU ARRIVE CHECKLIST

In order to have a smooth move-in process, Housing and Residence Life recommends you have the following steps completed prior to your arrival on campus.

S ORDER YOUR VANDAL CARD

A Vandal Card, the official student ID, is required to check into your residence hall and use your meal plan. Order your Vandal Card online and submit your own photo before you arrive to campus!

Cards typically take 2-3 days to ship so we recommend you order your card at least two weeks before your arrival. To order your card, visit uidaho.edu/check-in. You must have your Vandal Card with you in order to check into your room.

To ensure your card is available for check-in, any cards ordered after August 1 will be held for pick up on move-in day (see attached map).

SIGN-UP FOR VANDAL WELCOME

Vandal Welcome or New Student Orientation isn't just one event-it's a welcome to your new home on the University of Idaho campus. Sign-up online to join your fellow firstyear students at uidaho.edu/orientation-signup.

🗸 🛛 ORDER YOUR PARKING PERMIT

All vehicles parked on campus are required to pay for parking. Parking permit sales start online at noon on July 9 at uidaho.aimsparking.com. When you purchase before August 2 you can choose to have your permit mailed to your home or included with your move-in packet when you check in to your room.

Students living in residence halls can choose between a Silver or Economy permit, NCC residents who wish to park overnight at NCC should choose the NCC parking permit, which will also be valid for daytime parking in Blue lots. NCC residents are also eligible to purchase an Orange or Red permit.

RESIDENCE LIFE

Residence Life provides a vast support network to ensure your success while living on campus at the University of Idaho. Below is a description of each position to give you an idea of where to go for all your support needs.



Academic Peer Mentor (APM):

Our Academic Peer Mentors are student leaders with high academic standing who assist students living in our first-year communities. These mentors provide individualized support to help new students with academic skill building and transitioning to college-level work. APMs will also provide some free events throughout the year!

Resident Assistant (RA):

Every floor has an RA who is there to help answer questions and help make your experience the best! Be sure to meet them when you arrive!

Program Coordinators (PC):

Each living community has a PC who is responsible for setting up weekly activities for residents. There are also larger events each semester. Keep an eye out for these events and plan to attend with your neighbors and friends.

Resident Director (RD):

Each living option has a dedicated professional full time staff member who oversees the building. These staff are available as mentors and support for all the students living in their building.

Student Success Program (SSP):

We are dedicated to helping students succeed academically. Students have access to peer mentoring, free tutoring, study spaces, computer lab and additional support resources. Be sure to watch for some great free events!

Students living in Ballard, Gooding, Willey, Tower, LLC 1 - Gem, or


