

## Housing

- ♦ The median value of owner-occupied housing (adjusted for inflation) was \$169,110 between 2014 and 2018, compared to \$195,784 in Idaho and \$208,613 in the US.
- The median value was the 19th highest out of Idaho's 44 counties between 2014 and 2018.
- ♦ The number of housing units increased by 16.2% from 2000 to 2018, compared to an increase of 34.8% in Idaho.




### **Income**

- The county's per capita income in 2018 (adjusted for inflation) was \$35,758, compared to the state average of \$44,696 and the national average of \$55,433.
- Per capita income increased by 14.7% from 2008 to 2018, compared to an increase of 15.3% in Idaho and an increase of 14.1% in the US.
- The median household income (adjusted for inflation) was \$41,304 in 2018 compared to \$56,530 in Idaho and \$63,059 in the US.



## **Hispanic Population**

♦ Idaho County had 570 Hispanic residents in 2018.



## **Age Structure**

- ♦ 19.7% of Idaho County's population was under 18 in 2018, in contrast to 25.5% in Idaho and 22.4% in the US.
- ♦ In 2018, 52.4% of the population was 18 to 64 years old, compared to 58.7% in Idaho and 61.5% in the US.
- ♦ Idaho County's median age in 2018 was 50.2 compared to 36.6 in Idaho and 38.2 in the US.

**Note:** The Consumer Price Index (CPI) is a measure of inflation. Using the CPI to put dollar values in "real" terms makes it easier to see "inflation-free" change over time. Our base year is 2019, which means all dollar values are in terms of 2019 dollars.



# IDAHO COUNTY AT A GLANCE




### **COUNTY HIGHLIGHTS**

- ◆ Idaho County's total population in 2018 was 16,513.
- ♦ In 2018, the median household income was \$41,304.
- Idaho County's average annual unemployment rate was 4.7% in 2018.
- ♦ In 2018, Hispanic residents made up 3.5% of the population, compared to 12.7% in Idaho and 18.3% in the US.




## **Population Change**

- ◆ Idaho County had 16,513 residents in 2018, 246 more than 2010.
- Population increased by 1.5 percent between 2010 and 2018, compared to an increase of 11.9 percent in Idaho as a whole.





- Idaho County was the 26th fastest growing county out of Idaho's 44 counties between 2010 and 2018.
- Since 1970, Idaho County has gained 3,622 residents.
- ♦ Idaho County had migration & natural change rates that were below the state average between 2010 and 2018.




## **Employment**

- The average annual unemployment rate in 2018 was 4.7%, compared to 2.8% for Idaho and 3.9% for the US. Idaho County ranked 5th—from highest to lowest—out of Idaho's 44 counties.
- ♦ The largest number of jobs in 2018 were provided by government, farming, and retail trade.
- ♦ The number of jobs was 7,647 in 2018, compared to 5,153 in 1969—a 48% increase.

- ♦ In 2018, the self-employment rate was 38.9%, compared to 25.7% for Idaho and 23.1% for the US.
- ♦ The average wage per job in 2018 (adjusted for inflation) was \$36,927, up from \$34,352 a decade earlier. The average was \$43,659 in Idaho and \$58,304 in the US.



## **Social Trends**

### **Educational Attainment**

In Idaho County on average between 2014-2018...

- ♦ 9.4% of the population 25 years and older had no high school diploma, compared to 9.4% in Idaho and 12.3% in the US.
- ◆ 20.2% had a bachelor's degree or higher, compared to 26.9% in Idaho and 31.5% in the US.

### **Poverty**

- ♦ Idaho County's overall poverty rate decreased from 18.7% in 2008 when the recession began to 16.2% in 2018.
- Statewide, the overall poverty rate in 2018 was 11.7% and the US rate was 13.1%.
- Idaho County's child poverty rate (for people under 18) decreased from 25.3% in 2008 when the recession began to 21.7% in 2018.
- ♦ On average between 2014 and 2018, the poverty rate for people 65 and over was 11.1 percent.

### **Idaho County Youth**

- ◆ The teen birth rate in 2016 was 18 per 1,000, compared to 10 per 1,000 in Idaho and 9 per 1,000 in the US.
- On average between 2014 and 2018, teens who were not working, looking for work, and not in school made up 11.1% of all youth aged 16-19, compared to 6.8% in Idaho and 6.8% in the US.

#### Crime and Law Enforcement

In Idaho County in 2018...

- ◆ The total number of crimes reported was 90 per 10,000 population, compared to 169 in Idaho and 258 in the US.
- ♦ The number of sworn police officers per 1,000 population was 1.5, compared to 1.6 in Idaho and 2.1 in the US.
