

Housing

- ♦ The median value of owner-occupied housing (adjusted for inflation) was \$241,702 between 2014 and 2018, compared to \$195,784 in Idaho and \$208,613 in the US.
- The median value was the 5th highest out of Idaho's 44 counties between 2014 and 2018.
- ♦ The number of housing units increased by 48.7% from 2000 to 2018, compared to an increase of 34.8% in Idaho.




Income

- The county's per capita income in 2018 (adjusted for inflation) was \$45,802, compared to the state average of \$44,696 and the national average of \$55,433.
- Per capita income increased by 18.4% from 2008 to 2018, compared to an increase of 15.3% in Idaho and an increase of 14.1% in the US.
- The median household income (adjusted for inflation) was \$57,206 in 2018 compared to \$56,530 in Idaho and \$63,059 in the US.



Hispanic Population

Kootenai County had 7,734 Hispanic residents in 2018.



Age Structure

- ♦ 22.8% of Kootenai County's population was under 18 in 2018, in contrast to 25.5% in Idaho and 22.4% in the US.
- ♦ In 2018, 58.2% of the population was 18 to 64 years old, compared to 58.7% in Idaho and 61.5% in the US.
- ♦ Kootenai County's median age in 2018 was 40.5 compared to 36.6 in Idaho and 38.2 in the US.

Note: The Consumer Price Index (CPI) is a measure of inflation. Using the CPI to put dollar values in "real" terms makes it easier to see "inflation-free" change over time. Our base year is 2019, which means all dollar values are in terms of 2019 dollars.




COUNTY HIGHLIGHTS

- ♦ Kootenai County's total population in 2018 was 161,505.
- ♦ In 2018, the median household income was \$57,206.
- ♦ Kootenai County's average annual unemployment rate was 3.5% in 2018.
- ♦ In 2018, Hispanic residents made up 4.8% of the population, compared to 12.7% in Idaho and 18.3% in the US.




Population Change

- ♦ Kootenai Co. had 161,505 residents in 2018, 23,011 more than 2010.
- Population increased by 16.6 percent between 2010 and 2018, compared to an increase of 11.9 percent in Idaho as a whole.



- ♦ Kootenai County was the 3rd fastest growing county out of Idaho's 44 counties between 2010 and 2018.
- Since 1970, Kootenai County has gained 126,173 residents.
- Kootenai County had a migration rate above & natural change rate that was below the state average between 2010 and 2018.




Employment

- The average annual unemployment rate in 2018 was 3.5%, compared to 2.8% for Idaho and 3.9% for the US. Kootenai County ranked 16th—from highest to lowest—out of Idaho's 44 counties.
- The largest number of jobs in 2018 were provided by government, retail trade, and health care and social assistance.
- ♦ The number of jobs was 91,083 in 2018, compared to 12,784 in 1969—a 612% increase.

- ♦ In 2018, the self-employment rate was 27.3%, compared to 25.7% for Idaho and 23.1% for the US.
- ♦ The average wage per job in 2018 (adjusted for inflation) was \$40,184, up from \$37,230 a decade earlier. The average was \$43,659 in Idaho and \$58,304 in the US.



Social Trends

Educational Attainment

In Kootenai County on average between 2014-2018...

- ◆ 7.5% of the population 25 years and older had no high school diploma, compared to 9.4% in Idaho and 12.3% in the US.
- ◆ 24.9% had a bachelor's degree or higher, compared to 26.9% in Idaho and 31.5% in the US.

Poverty

- ♦ Kootenai County's overall poverty rate increased from 9.4% in 2008 when the recession began to 10.3% in 2018.
- ♦ Statewide, the overall poverty rate in 2018 was 11.7% and the US rate was 13.1%.
- Kootenai County's child poverty rate (for people under 18) decreased from 13.3% in 2008 when the recession began to 12.6% in 2018.
- ♦ On average between 2014 and 2018, the poverty rate for people 65 and over was 7.3 percent.

Kootenai County Youth

- ♦ The teen birth rate in 2017 was 6 per 1,000, compared to 6 per 1,000 in Idaho and 8 per 1,000 in the US.
- On average between 2014 and 2018, teens who were not working, looking for work, and not in school made up 7.3% of all youth aged 16-19, compared to 6.8% in Idaho and 6.8% in the US.

Crime and Law Enforcement

In Kootenai County in 2018...

- ◆ The total number of crimes reported was 178 per 10,000 population, compared to 169 in Idaho and 258 in the US.
- ♦ The number of sworn police officers per 1,000 population was 1.5, compared to 1.6 in Idaho and 2.1 in the US.
