

Summer Youth Leadership Program Facilitator

MAJOR FUNCTION

The instructor will assist in planning and implementing three, three-week sessions of the MOSS Summer Leadership program (BRAVE) for 10-14 year olds. The person in this position will organize instructional and fun activities for students interested in leadership in their community. This person will report to the MOSS Program Coordinator.

The Building Relationships, Adventure, and Values through the Environment program or BRAVE invites participants to explore the meaning of community through hands-on experiential learning outdoors. Students will build skills through mentorship, participating in field trips to McCall community partners, and practicing leadership with younger student audiences.

Experience working with children in older age groups 2. Enthusiasm for working outdoors 3. Previous experience supervising children in a camp setting and at waterfront 4. Proficiency with Spanish language (\$1.00/hr wage increase)
