Definitions

Taxable Income:

The gross income of an individual, less any allowable tax deductions. Your taxable income is the amount of your income that is subject to income tax. What qualifies as “taxable income” is defined in the Internal Revenue Code Section 63. “Gross income” is defined in Section 61 of the Internal Revenue Code.

Taxable income can be obtained from any of U.S. Individual Income Tax Return. On form 1040, starting with tax year 2023, taxable income is found on line 15.

Household Size or Family Unit:

Family size includes parent(s), or legal guardian(s) whose income is included in the taxable income amount reported and any dependents listed on the tax return, including the student.

Independent Student: You are considered independent by the Federal Government if you are:

- 1) 24 years of age by December 31 of award year
- 2) Married and/or have legal dependents other than spouse
- 3) Veteran of Armed Forces of the United States
- 4) An orphan, in foster care, or a ward of the court (now or any time after age 13)
- 5) Prior to age 18, an emancipated minor or in legal guardianship as determined by a court
- 6) Verified as an unaccompanied youth or homeless child or your
- 7) Is a student who the financial aid administrator has determined to be financially independent
