

RECRUITING GRADUATE STUDENTS FOR FUNDED RESEARCH IN INDIGENOUS STEM EDUCATION INITIATIVES

Seeking master's and doctorate candidates in interdisciplinary fields; anthropology, education, social sciences, STEM fields

> Cultivating Indigenous Research Communities for Leadership in Education and STEM (CIRCLES Alliance), seeks to advance educational opportunities for Indigenous students in partnership with universities and research institutions in six states, including Idaho.

Our team is recruiting its second cohort of CIRCLES scholars to begin their graduate education at the University of Idaho in the Fall of 2024. Scholars will complete a 13 credit Certificate in Indigenous Research & Education (CIRE) and contribute to a qualitative study with the team that aims to document how students, faculty, and institutions can engage Tribal Nation building efforts and support Indigenous STEM in partnership with higher education infrastructure.

Scholars will be funded as graduate research assistants and receive tuition, health insurance, and a living stipend of approximately \$23,400 over one year. We seek scholars who have experience with Indigenous STEM and community-based learning settings. Priority selection is given to American Indian, Alaska Native, Native Hawaiian, Indigenous, and historically underrepresented students.
