


# NBAPBUD: Position Budget Form



You will find this within Argos under:

Click on the Dashboard – Run Dashboard



Next enter the chart you want to view.

- 2018 and prior = Chart 9
- 2019 into the future= Chart V (or you can use Banner if you choose for 2019 on.)

Enter the Fiscal year

Enter the PCN number

You will get the same exact data you would have from Banner all on one page.
