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Cloverbuds is a fun, educational program for children ages 5-7 by January 1 of the current 4-H year.

The Cloverbuds program focuses on cooperative learning while guiding participants to:

- Develop life skills in self-understanding, social interaction, decision-making, learning to learn, and physical development.
- Gain knowledge through the experiential learning process.
- Develop positive attitudes toward learning.
- Develop on-going relationships with caring adults and older youths who serve as positive role models.
- Explore family and community relationships.
- Make new friends.
- Learn how to share, work together, compromise, and resolve conflict.
- Develop an understanding of and appreciation for social and cultural differences.



## Sample Lesson Ideas for Cloverbuds:

#### Week 1

**Bicycles:** Learn about safety, gear, road rules, and more.

#### Week 2

**4-H History:** Learn about the 4-H Pledge, the 4-H Motto, and why the program was started.

### Week 3

**Safety:** Make your home safe while exploring how we are different, yet the same.

#### Week 4

Arts & Crafts: Explore the basic elements and principles of design through sculpting, cutting, painting, printing, fiber arts, and 3-D construction.

#### Week 5

**Aerospace:** Start exploring the principles of flight and aerospace careers.

#### <u>Week 6</u>

**Robotics:** Improve your knowledge and skils in mathematics, literacy, science, and social studies in the LEGO Education program. Get better at solving problems, communicating, working with others, and being creative and innovative.

~The success of 4-H Cloverbuds depends upon the involvement of family and other adult volunteers who serve as club leaders or in other leadership roles. County extension staff are eager to talk to adults interested in helping with the 4-H Cloverbuds program.



The Cloverbuds program offers young children opportunities to explore and learn about their world in a positive environment. Children are encouraged to work cooperatively to explore topics ranging from arts/crafts and bicycling to making healthy food choices.



The approved Cloverbuds curriculum is developmentally appropriate for this age, is activity oriented, involves cooperative learning, is noncompetitive, and is focused on life skills taught through a broad spectrum of subject areas. Cloverbud members may be involved in lap animal projects such as rabbits, cavies, cats, small dogs (that weigh less than the member), chickens, and mini-goats. Fair exhibits by Cloverbuds are noncompetitive and are optional.
