#### Course of Fire

##### Juniors (ages 8-10)

- 1 end of 6 arrows each from 20 meters
- 1 end of 6 arrows each from 15 meters
- 2 end of 3 arrows each from 10 meters
- 3 end of 3 arrows each from 5 meters
- 3D shoot of 15 stations; 1 arrow shot at each station unmarked distances from 5 to 20 yards

##### Intermediates (ages 11-13)

- 2 ends of 6 arrows each from 25 meters
- 1 end of 6 arrows each from 20 meters
- 3 ends of 3 arrows each from 15 meters
- 3 ends of 3 arrows each from 10 meters
- 3D shoot of 15 stations; 1 arrow shot at each station unmarked distances from 5 to 30 yards

##### Seniors (ages 14-18)

- 3 ends of 6 arrows each from 60 to 50 meters
- 6 ends of 3 arrows each from 40 and 30 meters
- 3D Shoot of 30 stations; 1 arrow shot at each station unmarked distances from 5 to 50 yards

## EVENT SYNOPSIS

- **The Buckle Up shoot is a “Pilot Shoot” structured with the purpose to promote opportunity for encouraging youth to participate in archery events with a class that works best for them and their equipment.**
- **The course of fire has been reduced in distance for Juniors and Intermediates to allow for more pin(s) setup in their sights. No more “walking the arrow in” or guessing. Competitors should have a pin dedicated to each of the ranges for FITA.**
- **The course of fire for the Seniors has been left intact to National 4-H Standards to allow for Seniors participating in the recurve the opportunity to attend a National Event should they place in the top (3) three.**
- **The Buckle up Shoot has (4) four classes versus the traditional (2) two classes. These classes are still National 4-H Standard. By adding additional classes, competitors will have equal opportunity to success while competing with their peers at similar skill sets.**

- **2024 Idaho 4-H State Archery competition yielded only (1) one senior recurve competitor to represent Idaho at the 2025 4-H National Shooting Sports Competition in Grand Island, Nebraska.**
- **The top (3) three Senior recurve competitors for the 4-H Indoor Buckle Up Shoot may be given the opportunity to represent Idaho at Grand Island, Nebraska in June 2025.**

## Competitor Classes:

**(The equipment used on your bow determines the class you participate within.)**

### **Compound Open Class (Compound Hunting Bow/Target Bow):**

- Use any bow with any non-range providing sight with or without magnification lenses to include clarifiers and verifiers in the peep sight
- Use any length stabilizer(s) on front and/or back with no weight restriction
- No restrictions on release aid
- Spirit levels allowed
- 60 lb. maximum draw weight

### **Compound Pins Class (Compound Hunting Bow):**

- Use any bow with non-range providing sight with fixed pins, no pin limit, magnification lenses not permitted, clarifiers and verifiers in the peep sight are allowed
- Movable sights may be used but must be locked down into a fixed positioned that will be verified by the Chief Range Officer
- Front stabilizer up to 12” may be used, the mounting coupler and weights are to be included in the 12” limit, an archer with a disability may use a front stabilizer with no restrictions
- No restrictions on rear stabilizer
- No restrictions on release aid
- Spirit levels allowed
- 60 lb. maximum draw weight

### **Recurve Open Class (Olympic Style/Recurve/Longbow):**

- Use any recurve/longbow style bow with non-ranging providing sight, with one (1) adjustable sight pin or multiple hunting style sight pins
- Clicker and kisser buttons permitted
- Use any length stabilizer(s) on front and/or back with no weight restriction
- Torque compensators permitted
- String peeps, mechanical release aids, and lenses of any type in sight are not permitted
- 60 lb. maximum draw weight

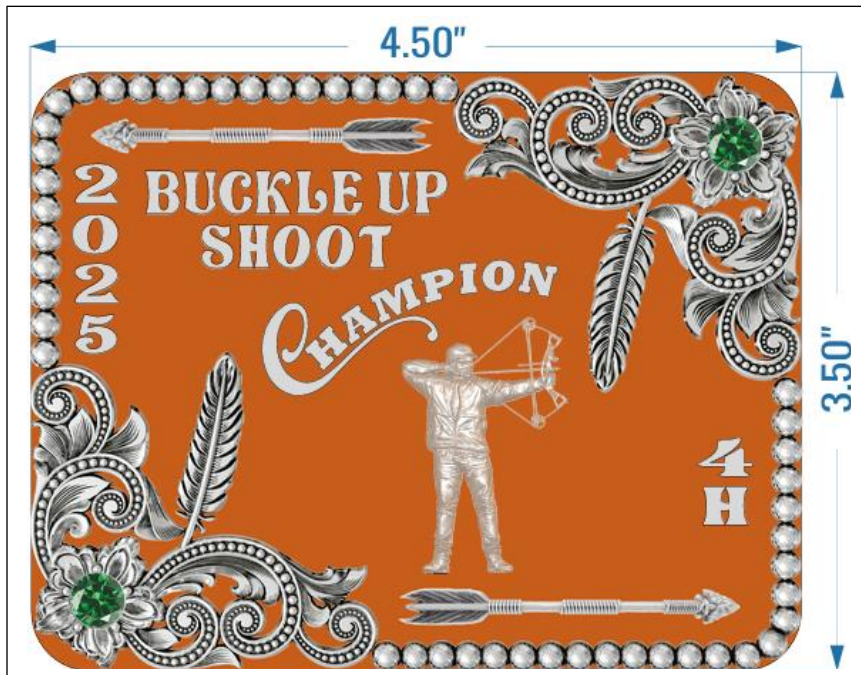
### **Traditional “Barebow” Class (Recurve/Longbow):**

- Use any recurve/longbow (bows without wheels, pulleys, and cams)
- No sights or spirit levels allowed
- No restriction on Rest
- Front stabilizer up to 12” which includes any quick lock attachments
- Kisser buttons are allowed
- Mechanical release aids not permitted, finger tabs will be allowed
- 60 lb. maximum draw weight

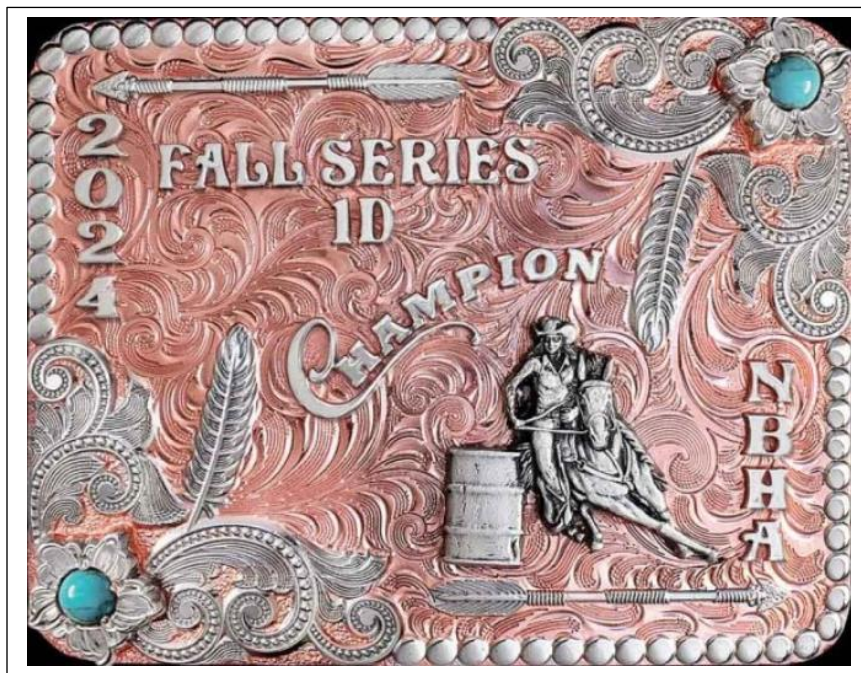
**4-H retains the right to waive certain equipment restrictions or shooting rules under specific circumstances for physically challenged competitors.**

- **Use of phones, earbuds, and range finding devices is not allowed by competitors**
- **Binoculars and range card(s) may be used**

- Awards will be given to 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 3<sup>rd</sup> place participants of each age division and for each class of both FITA and 3D.
- Buckle award for high score in each age division/class based on overall combined scores of FITA and 3D.

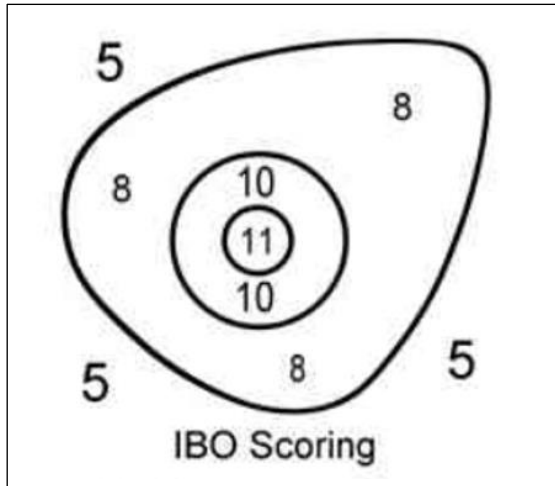


Rendering artwork of the buckle to be awarded.

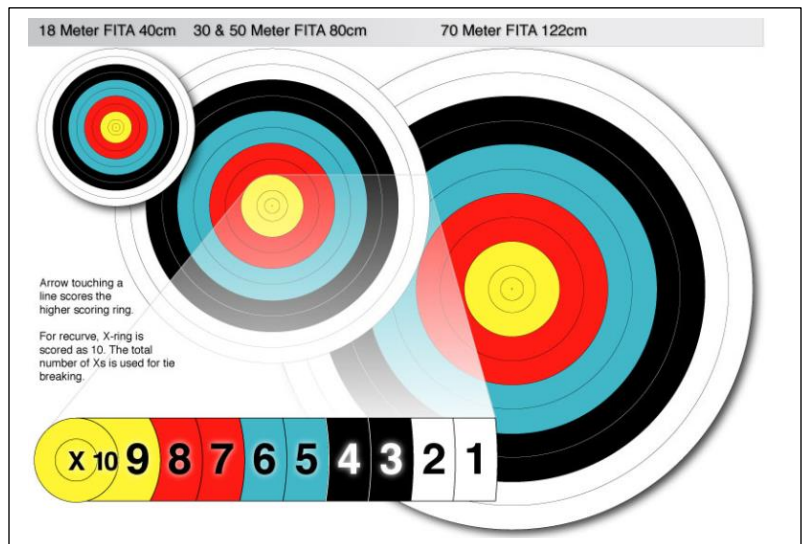


Actual buckle minus the lettering, figure, and gem stones as show above.

## Whistle Commands:

2 Whistles = Archers ready your equipment and approach the shooting line

1 Whistle = Shooting line is hot, you may commence firing

3 Whistles = Archers to the target line to score your arrows

4 or more Whistles = Cease fire and ground your bows
