Individually identify each animal with an ear tag and/or tattoo.		
Provide a Brand Inspection or Recorded Iron Brand as positive proof of ownership for each		
project animal for at least 150 days.		
Weigh and provide primary care for all animals on a uniform county feeding period for a		
minimum of 130 days.		
Provide appropriate documentation, which includes a brand inspection, and/or a bill of sale.		
Contact your local Extension Office for exact forms required and deadlines.		
Complete five (5) Animal Science lessons/activities, gain at least five (5) new skills per year from		
the Idaho 4-H Animal Science Skills Checklist. One (1) must be Quality Assurance related.		
Complete the 4-H Project Record Book for this project in your ZSuite Member Account		
Fill out your 4-H Involvement Report in your ZSuite Member Account		
Give an oral presentation (speech, demonstration, or illustrated talk) to your 4-H peers on a topic related		
to this project. Recommended guidelines for length of oral presentations are:		
Junior: 5-8 minutes		
Intermediate: 8-10 minutes		
Senior: 10-12 minutes
