# About Butterflies



Butterflies are not only beautiful, they are also incredibly interesting! Their lifespan depends upon their species. Some live less than a

week, others as long as two years. During their lifespan, they undergo a complete four-stage metamorphosis: from egg, to larva, to pupa, and finally, to adult. Most fly only during the day on wings that are made of pigmented scales. The scales scatter light into the colors that we see and even some colors, like ultraviolet, that we don't.

There are over 150 species of butterflies in Idaho. The Monarch butterfly (Danaus plexippus) may be found throughout most of Idaho and was adopted in 1992 as the official State Insect of Idaho.

When deciding which plants to use in your butterfly garden, consider plants that provide for butterflies throughout their lifespan: flowers with nectar for the adults, plants that shelter their eggs and plants that feed their larvae.

## Plants to Attract Butterflies

Butterflies are attracted to flowers of many colors, shapes, and sizes. Yellow, blue, purple and sometimes red blossoms with flat surfaces, clustered florets and large-lipped petals are their favorites. They also prefer sunny areas that are well protected from the wind.
