LATAH COUNTY FAIR OFFICE

- Fair registration is due on August 16. Registration is live now!
- Please be sure to correctly select FFA vs 4-H in your registration!
- Tent camping needs to be registered under "camper under 35 ft" with license plate TENT.
- Market turkeys will need to present their bill of sale to the superintendent on Wednesday of Fair at check in.
- Please check your animal for any sign of illness (warts, ring worm, etc.)! This needs to be treated ASAP—and documented! Sick animals are not permitted.

- Commission fee has been set at 3% of the animal sale price.
- When inviting potential buyers to the sale, please remember to invite them to support 4-H/FFA in general. The state 4-H program has policies against asking for direct financial support of individuals. Feel free to talk about your project but avoid statements such as "come buy my animal at the sale." Use "come support local 4-H/FFA youth at the sale."

Palouse Preview & Classic

The Palouse Preview is offered the evening of Friday, August 2 at the Latah County Fairgrounds. This show was created for youth that live in the nearby region to hone their showmanship skills. Judges work with participants to further develop showmanship techniques and answer any questions youth have.

The Palouse Classic is on Saturday, August 3 and is open to youth from across the country to compete in livestock showing. Very talented youth participate in this show and are often willing to answer questions from other youth that attend to watch.

For youth interested in learning more about showmanship but not able to bring an animal to compete are highly encouraged to attend, watch, and ask questions!

Fashion Orientation - August 22, 5:30pm, Fairgrounds Attach your clothing commentaries to ZSuite registration prior to the meeting.

Fashion Revue – August 29, 4:30-6:30pm Fairgrounds

Arrive 15 minutes prior to your selected modeling time. Bring your outfit and accessories to change into or come dressed.

Book & Project DUE – September 3, 5:00pm

All clothing and other sewing projects are due to the Extension Office by 5:00pm.

Style Revue – September 12, 5:00pm, Fairgrounds

Arrive at the Large Room at 4:15pm to pick up your sewn items. You will change at the Events Center prior to Style Revue.

Commentaries:

It is recommended that you practice reading your Fashion Revue Commentary before submitting it in ZSuite. Ideally, your commentary will be 60-90 seconds or 120-150 words for beginners, 150-200 for advanced.

RECORD BOOKS

THE BASICS

- ZSuite is Idaho's statewide 4-H record book system.
- Record books should be mostly typed, but will likely include handwritten sections (i.e. stories).
- The 4-H Story is about the total experience, so members may write one story to cover all projects for the year. Include a copy in each record book.
- Record books must be signed to be "complete".
- Write N/A in any fields that do not apply.
- All project record books include an Involvement Report and may have additional inserts (i.e. Animal Science Skills Checklist, Producer Affidavit).
- Remember: what you turn in is how you will be judged.

Record Book Due Dates

<u>Clothing & Textiles</u>—record books AND exhibits: **Tuesday, September 3, 5:00pm at the Extension Office.**

<u>Non-market animal (breeding, pet)</u>—record books are due: **Tuesday, September 3, 5:00pm at the Extension Office.**


<u>General Projects & Cloverbuds</u>—record books are due with your exhibits at check-in: Wednesday, September 11, 3:00—7:00pm at the Events Center at the Fairgrounds.

Market Animal Record Books: Due Sunday, September 15, 2:00 pm—4:00 pm at the Extension mobile office near the Sale Barn. This applies to all market animal species.

How to Guide:

- 1. Log into ZSuite
- 2. Select the appropriate youth profile
- 3. Select Record Books on the black navigation bar on the left.
- To start a new record book, select the green +Record Book button. To edit a book, select the pencil on the right. Enter the appropriate information and select SAVE.
- To edit a previous year's Involvement Report, use the pencil and adjust the dates to include this year. New members can create a new involvement by selecting the +Record Book button.
