### Affordable, Robust Broadband Internet Service

<u>Federal Communications Commission's Affordable Connectivity Program</u> is a benefit program that provides grant subsidies to eligible households to pay monthly internet service costs.

<u>Education Superhighway</u> works to increase adoption of the Affordable Connectivity Program.

<u>Idaho Commission for Libraries Public Wi-Fi Map</u> shows free public Wi-Fi hotspots at Idaho's Public Libraries.

The Idaho State Department of Education (SDE) Broadband Program is responsible for reimbursing Idaho's E-rate eligible entities for the remaining portion of eligible broadband costs after their E-rate discount is applied.

<u>Idaho State Department of Education's Empowering Parents program</u> provides funding for Idaho students to purchase internet devices.

### Internet-enabled Devices that Meet the Needs of the User

<u>Idaho Commission for Libraries Connection Communities Digital Inclusion Program</u> provides Chromebooks and accessories to public libraries throughout Idaho for the purpose of expanding digital inclusion, equity, and literacy efforts.

<u>PCs for People</u> provides refurbished computers to eligible customers for affordable prices.

<u>TechSoup</u> provides refurbished laptop computers for libraries, nonprofits, and others.

Idaho <u>Empowering Parents Program</u> provides eligible families with grants funds for use toward eligible education services and devices.

## Access to Digital Literacy Training

<u>Idaho Digital Skills</u>, provided by the Idaho Commission for Libraries offers Idahoans free access to online learning tools to increase their digital skills in English and Spanish.

<u>Google for Education Applied Digital Skills</u> courses are free learning modules that teach practical digital skills.

<u>University of Idaho Extension's Digital Economy Program</u> will provide digital skill development resources in Idaho communities.

## **Quality Technical Support**

<u>National Digital Inclusion Alliance's Digital Navigator Model</u> engages individuals who address the whole digital inclusion process — home connectivity, devices, and digital skills — with community members through repeated interactions.

## Applications and Online Content Designed to Enable and Encourage Self Sufficiency, Participation, and Collaboration

<u>Idaho Digital E-Book Alliance (IDEA)</u> is a statewide partnership between the Idaho Commission for Libraries (ICfL), public libraries, and school libraries with the goal of expanding access while reducing barriers to digital e-books and e-audio.

<u>Libraries Linking Idaho (LiLI)</u> is a group of projects and services that bring networked library service to the residents of Idaho.

<u>Idaho Relay Service</u>, through Hamilton Relay, provides telecommunications relay services for the state of Idaho including TTY, Voice Carry Over (VCO), Hearing Carry Over (HCO), Speech-to-Speech (STS), Visually Assisted Speech-to-Speech (VA STS), Spanish and CapTel®.
