Honoring Senator and Louise McClure's legacy, the McClure Center for Public Policy Research proudly offers dynamic, high-level, applied learning programs for undergraduate and graduate students at the University of Idaho. These programs provide invaluable, firsthand exposure to public policy analysis, design, and implementation, across multiple levels of government. Throughout their semester-long experience, students engage directly with policy makers, gain practical insights into policy making processes, and develop skills needed to become future leaders in public service.

Vandal Giving Day 2024 was a record-breaking success, raising over \$1.1 million to support University of Idaho student programs!

The McClure Center for Public Policy Research received \$3,480 from 22 generous gifts, directly supporting students in both undergraduate and graduate programs. These contributions provide invaluable opportunities for hand-on learning and professional growth.

In 2025, we aim to raise even more to **support undergraduate interns** who spend a semester in Boise immersed in public policy, the state legislature, and local communities. Students travel from Moscow to spend a full semester in Boise. Funds provide support for housing and professional wardrobes and help interns attend professional development events.

These experiences equip students with essential skills, preparing them for future careers and leadership roles in Idaho and beyond.
