



Example: If the program is assessing one program learning outcome this semester, the rubric could be used by all faculty who have an assignment or student interaction appropriate for assessment purposes. As these use the rubric, student data is captured and can easily be aggregated and pulled into Anthology Outcomes by the Department Chair/Program Head. The rubric can be reused in a future semester by adding a "new" assessment in Step 3 above. Some programs find it helpful to include the semester name in the title, to differentiate when each one was collected.
