



**M.Ed./M.S. Rehabilitation Counseling and Human Services Program
Rehabilitation Services Administration (RSA) Scholarship Application**

A limited number of scholarships are available to students, called scholars. The RSA Scholarship provides payment for tuition and fees, stipends to be used toward books and supplies, and costs for attending professional conferences. If awarded the scholarship, the scholar agrees to complete an internship at IDVR and work for a state Vocational Rehabilitation Agency (e.g., Idaho Division of Vocational Rehabilitation) or other approved related-rehabilitation agency for two years upon graduation for every year of funding a scholar receives.

Minimum qualifications:

- **Must be accepted into the Rehabilitation Counseling and Human Services Master's Program**
Note: Priority for this scholarship is given to full-time students on track or intending to graduate with their cohort within 2 year time frame
- **Interest in working for a State Vocational Rehabilitation agency**
- **Be in good academic standing**

Need to submit application:

- **Current resume**
- **Essay- write a 2 ½ - 3 pgs (double spaced) essay in a Word document on why you want to work for a State Vocational Rehabilitation (VR) agency and/or related-rehabilitation agency (i.e., community rehabilitation programs, independent living) and describe your career goals within such settings.**
