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The 17/18 FAFSA asks for parents' marital status as of the date the 17/18 FAFSA was completed, but it asks for parental income and tax return information from 2015. Therefore, your marital status may be different than it was when the 2015 tax return was filed.

What if my marital status as of the date my student's 17/18 FAFSA was filed is different than the marital status reported on my 2015 tax return?

- If you filed a joint tax return for 2015 but were no longer married when your student filed the 17/18 FAFSA, you will need to subtract the tax return information for your former spouse to correctly answer the required questions on the PTIV form.
- If you did not file a joint tax return for 2015, but were re-married when your student filed the 17/18 FAFSA, you will need to add the 2015 tax return information for your current spouse to correctly answer the FAFSA questions with both your information and your new spouse's information when you are answering the required questions on the PTIV form.

What if my current spouse is different from the spouse listed on my 2015 tax return?

- If you filed a joint tax return for 2015, but were married to a different person when your student filed the 17/18 FAFSA, you will need to subtract the tax return information for your former spouse, and then add the 2015 tax return information for your current spouse to correctly answer the required questions on the PTIV form.

What if I am recently widowed?

- If you recently became widowed, you'll need to subtract the tax return information for your spouse to correctly answer the required questions on the PTIV form.
