HOLLAND & HART NATURAL RESOURCES / ENVIRONMENTAL LAW WRITING PRIZE

The Holland & Hart Prize is awarded each Spring to the student who submits the most accomplished research paper on a topic in natural resources or environmental law and policy. The papers should address both the law and the science (physical, biological, social, political, or otherwise) that is relevant to the issue examined.

The winner will receive \$1,000, will be noted on the Holland & Hart plaque in the law school, and will be recognized at graduation.

The Holland & Hart Prize is open exclusively to students currently enrolled full time at the University of Idaho College of Law, including students enrolled in concurrent J.D./M.S. or Ph.D. programs.

Submissions cannot have been published prior to entry in the competition. The research and writing must be substantially the student's individual work. Co-authored work is not eligible. The fact that the student has developed a paper based on the comments of faculty or peers does not by itself render the paper ineligible.

Submissions will be judged on the basis of: qualify of writing and analysis, depth of research, importance and timeliness of the topic, and the difficulty of the subject matter. Submissions will be screened by three UI Law faculty members. The final decision will be made by reviewers at the Holland & Hart law firm.

Submissions shall comply with the length and format requirements for the upperdivision writing requirement. Citation should conform to the most current edition of the *Blue Book*.

Submissions are due on April 1, and should be double-spaced in 14-point font. Please submit one cover sheet with the author's name and the title of the work and three copies of the submission that do no contain the author's name to Sande in the Main Office. We anticipate the annual prize will be announced by May 15.
