
Housing

- ♦ The median value of owner-occupied housing (adjusted for inflation) was \$148,238 between 2014 and 2018, compared to \$195,784 in Idaho and \$208,613 in the US.
- The median value was the 33rd highest out of Idaho's 44 counties between 2014 and 2018.
- ♦ The number of housing units increased by 18.2% from 2000 to 2018, compared to an increase of 34.8% in Idaho.




Income

- ◆ The county's per capita income in 2018 (adjusted for inflation) was \$37,523, compared to the state average of \$44,696 and the national average of \$55,433.
- Per capita income increased by 8.8% from 2008 to 2018, compared to an increase of 15.3% in Idaho and an increase of 14.1% in the US.
- The median household income (adjusted for inflation) was \$50,238 in 2018 compared to \$56,530 in Idaho and \$63,059 in the US.



Hispanic Population

Elmore County had 4,738 Hispanic residents in 2018.



Age Structure

- ◆ 25.5% of Elmore County's population was under 18 in 2018, in contrast to 25.5% in Idaho and 22.4% in the US.
- ♦ In 2018, 61.7% of the population was 18 to 64 years old, compared to 58.7% in Idaho and 61.5% in the US.
- ♦ Elmore County's median age in 2018 was 31.7 compared to 36.6 in Idaho and 38.2 in the US.

Note: The Consumer Price Index (CPI) is a measure of inflation. Using the CPI to put dollar values in "real" terms makes it easier to see "inflation-free" change over time. Our base year is 2019, which means all dollar values are in terms of 2019 dollars.


COUNTY HIGHLIGHTS

- **♦** Elmore County's total population in 2018 was 27,259.
- ♦ In 2018, the median household income was \$50,238.
- ◆ Elmore County's average annual unemployment rate was 3.3% in 2018.
- ♦ In 2018, Hispanic residents made up 17.4% of the population, compared to 12.7% in Idaho and 18.3% in the US.




Population Change

- ♦ Elmore County had 27,259 residents in 2018, 221 more than 2010.
- Population increased by 0.8 percent between 2010 and 2018, compared to an increase of 11.9 percent in Idaho as a whole.



- Elmore County was the 33rd fastest growing county out of Idaho's 44 counties between 2010 and 2018.
- Since 1970, Elmore County has gained 9,780 residents.
- ♦ Elmore County had a migration rate below & natural change rate that was above the state average between 2010 and 2018.




Employment

- The average annual unemployment rate in 2018 was 3.3%, compared to 2.8% for Idaho and 3.9% for the US. Elmore County ranked 19th—from highest to lowest—out of Idaho's 44 counties.
- ♦ The largest number of jobs in 2018 were provided by government and retail trade.
- ♦ The number of jobs was 13,589 in 2018, compared to 8,627 in 1969—a 58% increase.

- ♦ In 2018, the self-employment rate was 20.2%, compared to 25.7% for Idaho and 23.1% for the US.
- ♦ The average wage per job in 2018 (adjusted for inflation) was \$35,003, up slightly from \$33,114 a decade earlier. The average was \$43,659 in Idaho and \$58,304 in the US.



Social Trends

Educational Attainment

In Elmore County on average between 2014-2018...

- ◆ 10.6% of the population 25 years and older had no high school diploma, compared to 9.4% in Idaho and 12.3% in the US.
- ◆ 16.4% had a bachelor's degree or higher, compared to 26.9% in Idaho and 31.5% in the US.

Poverty

- ♦ Elmore County's overall poverty rate decreased from 14.0% in 2008 when the recession began to 12.9% in 2018.
- ♦ Statewide, the overall poverty rate in 2018 was 11.7% and the US rate was 13.1%.
- ♦ Elmore County's child poverty rate (for people under 18) increased from 18.9% in 2008 when the recession began to 20.1% in 2018.
- ♦ On average between 2014 and 2018, the poverty rate for people 65 and over was 10.3 percent.

Elmore County Youth

- ♦ The teen birth rate in 2017 was 18 per 1,000, compared to 6 per 1,000 in Idaho and 8 per 1,000 in the US.
- On average between 2014 and 2018, teens who were not working, looking for work, and not in school made up 2.8% of all youth aged 16-19, compared to 6.8% in Idaho and 6.8% in the US.

Crime and Law Enforcement

In Elmore County in 2018...

- ◆ The total number of crimes reported was 140 per 10,000 population, compared to 169 in Idaho and 258 in the US.
- ♦ The number of sworn police officers per 1,000 population was 2.1, compared to 1.6 in Idaho and 2.1 in the US.
