Courses Developed at the University of Idaho:

Introduction to Animal, Veterinary and Food Sciences (AVFS 101, 1 credit, Fall). Created an overview of animal, veterinary and food sciences for first year AVFS students. An introduction of programs, courses, and facilities, including weekly faculty speakers, activities, discussions, and presentations of topics concerning issues facing animal, veterinary, and food scientists, as well as information about resources for assistance with retention related areas (academics, campus resources, extracurricular activities and clubs, internships and careers).

Equine Science and Management (AVS 466, 3 credits, Fall). Updated lecture materials, PowerPoint presentations, adopted new textbooks, developed assignments, course project and evaluation methods in 2011. Modified lecture content and format. In 2013, implemented laboratory sections to allow opportunity to gain hands-on experience, implement and practice methods taught in lecture. Course provides an understanding of science and production related to care and management, including horse anatomy and physiology, nutrition, reproduction, genetics, health care, selection and evaluation, and career opportunities in the horse industry.

Issues in Animal Agriculture (AVS 450, 2 credits, Spring & Fall). Initiated improvement in course by enhancing course rigor to better educate students on issues related to animal agriculture. In 2018, increased course from 1 credit to 2 credits due to changes implemented. Expanded innovative activities, requiring students to create posters with a partner that are presented to and evaluated by faculty and graduate students. Also added an oral presentation at semester end that is also peer reviewed. This departmental senior capstone course provides discussion of current, selected topics related to animal agriculture with an emphasis on problem solving using integration of information across disciplines.
