

RESIDENTIAL PROGRAMS SCHEDULE

The bulk of the instructional day, approximately 6 hours, is spent in Ponderosa State Park studying various ecosystems, habitats, and conducting place-based inquiries. The goal is to develop student understanding of various earth system components and the relationships between physical, biological, and social systems.

Chaperones and teachers will supervise students throughout the program. MOSS staff and Graduate Students will provide curriculum during the field portion and accompany chaperones, students, and teachers in the field.
