ELIGIBILITY

- 1) Member must have completed 3 or more years in 4-H and have passed his/her 14th birthday at the time of application.
- 2) The 4-H member's leader must approve and sign the application. A recommendation should be attached.
- 3) The member should have as close to 200 points as possible with the last 2 years to be eligible (2 year period may be any recent 2 year period. **200 points is a guideline, not a minimum.**
- 4) A brief statement of the member's greatest leadership achievement in 4-H. 100 words or more.
- 5) Previous winners of this award are not eligible.
- 6) A selection committee will determine the wristwatch winner. Their decision does not have to based solely on the grand total of points accumulated by applicants.

PROCEDURE

- 1) Read the instructions in each section carefully before recording your achievements.
- 2) Include your most important achievements up to the maximum number allowed in each section.
- Record appropriate points for your level of participation in the boxes behind each contest, activity, etc. Total points for each line in right hand column, then use the "TOTAL" column.

1. Contest Participation

You may select up to 15 4-H contests in which you participated within the last 2 years. Include contests representing 2 or more project/subject areas. These may include any competitive event where awards were given such as: style revue, wool scholarship contest, fitting and showing, identification contest, judging, demonstrations, public speaking, photography, or any other where the award was not based solely on your project record or exhibit. Points may be applied as follow:

Note: Projects are grouped according to the 8 project categories as listed in the 4-H Project Code for Idaho. Points for each project or unit are indicated after the project. More advanced projects/units are worth more points. Projects recommended for members younger than 12 are not listed and should not be used to earn points. County projects may be listed if they are recommended for members over 12. County Office should assign points appropriate to the amount of time and effort needed to complete the project, using this list as a guideline.
